What is Community?

The word "community" is used frequently in our modern world, but its depth in the kingdom of God is far more profound than we often realize.

Today we'll explore three pillars: the state of their hearts, the surrender of their wealth, and the desire of God.



Two Definitions of Community

1 Webster's Definition

A group of people living in the same place or having characteristics in common. A feeling of fellowship from sharing attitudes, interests, and goals.

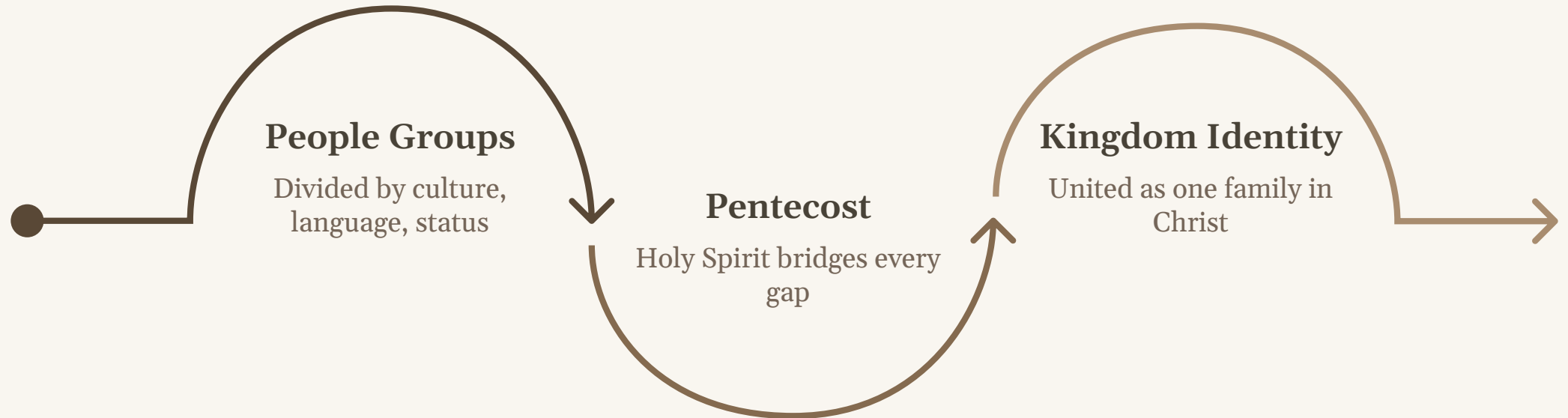
Built on similarity — same neighborhood, same hobbies, same lifestyle.

2 Biblical Definition (Koinonia)

Fellowship, association, communion, and joint participation. Not built on hobbies or zip codes, but on **shared life in Christ**.

The transition from "group of individuals" to "the body of Christ."

From Tribes to One Body



Humanity naturally divides into "people groups," but Acts 2 shows the power of the Holy Spirit to bridge these gaps. At Pentecost, different people groups were woven into a single family.

"There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." —
Galatians 3:28

The Posture of the Heart

The "one heart and soul" in Acts 2 is a fulfillment of God's long-standing desire for His people to move past legalism into genuine relationship.



Heart of Stone Removed

"How good and pleasant when God's people live together in unity!" — *Psalms 133:1*



One Mind, One Spirit

"Being like-minded, having the same love, one in spirit and mind." — *Philippians 2:2*

The Original Design

The growth in Acts was the result of people living out God's design: to be a light to the nations and a house of prayer.

- **Walk humbly** — devoted in prayer

The Witness of Love

A House of Prayer for All Nations



Devoted to Prayer

Acts 2:42 shows prayer as a core desire of God — His house called to be a house of prayer for all nations.



Breaking Bread Together

They devoted themselves to fellowship and breaking bread, creating authentic relationships beyond surface-level connection.

"For my house will be called a house of prayer for all nations." — *Isaiah 56:7*
